Re: Employers' response to the Commission second-stage consultation on European Works Councils

With this letter BUSINESSEUROPE, UEAPME and CEEP would like to address to the European Commission their joint response to the second-stage consultation of the European social partners on the revision of Council Directive 94/45/EC of 22 September 1994 on the establishment of European Works Councils, which was initiated by the European Commission on 20 February in accordance with Article 138 of the EC Treaty.

We are pleased to inform you that employers are looking forward to the opening of negotiations on European Works Councils.

Building upon an in-depth assessment of EWCs' practical experiences and needs, our main objective will be to agree on amendments to the EU legislative framework, which will help improve the functioning of EWCs in practice.
