"Is NO<sub>x</sub> and SO<sub>2</sub> trading smart policy?"

## **PROGRAMME**

In order to pursue the decrease in industrial emissions witnessed in Europe since the 1990s, European companies need favourable, stable, consistent and predictable policy conditions. A comprehensive air quality legislative arsenal is already in place in Europe. However, the European Commission is investigating the feasibility of a European emissions trading scheme for industrial  $NO_x$  and  $SO_2$  emissions. There is a lot of on-going debate about which policy option would better deliver air quality goals.

The seminar will bring together European legislators, representatives of European industry and NGOs to debate the economic and environmental pertinence of adding a European  $NO_x$  and  $SO_2$  emissions trading scheme to the existing regulatory landscape and what policy alternatives can be explored.

The seminar will be moderated by Marco Mensink, Chairman of BUSINESSEUROPE's  $NO_xSO_2$  trading Task Force.
